YEAR 12, 2017 – WACE RESULTS

The College is very proud of the achievements of the Class of 2017 in the recent Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) examinations. Congratulations to the students and staff who have worked hard to maintain such high standards.

From past experience we can expect that all of our Year 12 University candidates will be offered a place at a University. Furthermore, a high proportion of these students will gain their first choice at University or with a State Training Provider (STP). For the Class of 2017, 69.3% of students have been offered their first preference at University this year.

97.3 % of our Year 12 students achieved the Western Australian Certificate of Education.

Based on the median ATAR score for all students who enrolled in four or more ATAR courses, Ursula Frayne ranked 21 in the State. The College has consistently achieved in the top 50 secondary schools in Western Australia. In 2017 the College was measured against 186 schools.

Our median Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) of 87.15 was above the State median of 81.40.

Of the students eligible to obtain an ATAR:

- 15 (16.3%) students achieved an ATAR greater 95
- 35 (38.0%) students achieved an ATAR greater 90
- 52 (56.5%) students achieved an ATAR greater 85
- 62 (67.4%) students achieved an ATAR greater 80

The following students gained School Curriculum and Standards Authority Awards:

Awards for Consistent School Achievement

A Certificate of Merit or Certificate of Distinction is awarded to each eligible student who, in their last three consecutive years of senior secondary WACE enrolment, achieves: Certificate of Merit 150-189 points and Certificate of Distinction 190-200 points. When a student receives 10 end of year A grades over Year 11 & 12 they are awarded a Certificate of Distinction.

Success in the ASPIRE Pathway

We have called the Vocational Education & Training pathway the ASPIRE pathway. It's an acronym that stands for Achieve, Skills, Pathways, Innovation, Resilience and Excellence. The success achieved in this pathway at Frayne deserves a title that is more affirming than NON ATAR.

Vocational Education and Training

Amongst this cohort, there was an understanding of the importance of selecting and studying VET certificates (on and off campus) so that they could articulate directly into a Diploma (first year university equivalent) study both at TAFE and Private College. These students, who are predominantly studying Nursing or Business, will be accepted into second year of an undergraduate degree upon completion.

The students seeking apprenticeships were offered the opportunity to study our Construction, Engineering, and Hospitality certificates (on campus) combined with Pre-apprenticeships (off campus) to make them competitive for post school full time apprenticeships.

70 students from Year 11-12 at Ursula Frayne who undertook a VET program achieved a Certificate III or higher.

The whole Ursula Frayne community can take pride in these terrific results. The many excellent results reflect the effective partnership of teachers, students and parents supporting a culture of academic excellence.
