

The School Board at Ursula Frayne Catholic College has been constituted to help the School fulfil its educational responsibilities, in accordance with the Catholic School Board Constitution WA.

The Board is responsible for the present and future planning of the College, including managing the financial performance and capital developments. In addition, the Board disseminates information about the School and about Catholic education to the School Community.

From time to time our Board functions may also include membership on selection panels for School leaders, including the Principal.

Our Board is comprised of parents, a representative from Friends of Frayne, a Parish priest, drawn from Our Lady Help of Christians and/or St Joachim's parishes and the College Principal. The Friends of Frayne representative provides a report to the Board each month.

Board Members are elected at the Board Annual General Meeting (AGM) and serve for a period of two years. Nominations for the Board are publicised in accordance with the constituted process and nomination is open to all members of the UFCC Community. An elected member cannot serve for more than six consecutive years on the College Board.

The work of each Board member is voluntary, in the spirit of giving to the School. Each member of the Board brings skills that are an asset to the work of the Board and are deeply interested in the welfare of all students and staff at UFCC.

Board meetings are held monthly and are capably steered by the Board Chair, with the support of the Deputy Chair and Treasurer. The College Business Manager and Vice Principal provide non-voting support to the Board. The Board has a regular Finance Sub-committee, and from time to time has established other sub-committees to support strategy and decision making, which have included:

- Capital Projects (current)
- Future Directions (no longer running)
- Marketing (2016)
- Review of Scholarships and Bursaries (2017)

The Board works collaboratively and constructively, demonstrating a commitment to the UFCC Mercy Values and Catholic Ethos to fulfil Board constitutional objects.

The Board provides a mid-year report to the UFCC community at the end of Term-2, in addition to the Chairs Report which is presented at the AGM in November each year and published in the College Annual.
