## From the Principal

Dear Parents, Students and Friends of Ursula Frayne Catholic College,

### NAIDOC WEEK

In the lead up to NAIDOC Week, students on the Balmoral Street campus participated in two special assemblies during which we reflected on the very rich heritage of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. On Monday morning, Mr Shaun Nannup conducted a smoking ceremony with the students and staff on the Duncan Street campus who gathered in the central courtyard prior to the commencement of classes.

The smoking ceremony is an ancient aboriginal custom in Australia that involves burning various native plants to produce smoke, which has cleansing properties and the ability to ward off bad spirits from the people and the land and make a pathway for a brighter future. Certain traditional smoking ceremonies are also believed to be used for positive therapeutic outcomes dependent on what plants are available from region to region. Participation in a smoking ceremony is a gift from the aboriginal people to all people in Australia so make sure you go to the smoke and wave it over you and cleanse the past for a better future.

On Sunday 7 July, parishes will celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and contribution to the society and the Church. This year's theme is *"Peace to this house and all who dwell within"*. At this time, we are invited to reflect and make time to look for inner peace in our busy lives and celebrate with families, friends and the wider community God's message of peace and love for all.

his visit to Australia in 1986 is often quoted, “the Church in Australia will not be the Church Jesus intended her to be until the Aboriginal people have made their contribution and this is joyfully accepted”. This was a watershed moment for the identity and shape of the Church and Mission in Australia. However, the statement does presume that we, as a Church, know our identity and what our mission now is in this land. As such, the Church in Australia is actively involved in such a process of discernment through the *Plenary Council 2020* in which we are encouraged to “listen to what the Spirit is saying” (Rev 2.7).

The Church in Australia is still being shaped by the land and the ancient culture she has encountered. She not only needs Aboriginal people to contribute – she needs to ask Aboriginal people what it means to live the Gospel of Jesus in this ancient land.

The two lungs of the Church in Australia are Indigenous and non-Indigenous being constantly filled by the Holy Spirit breathing the eternal newness of the Gospel. We are part of the Body of Christ with gifts of the Holy Spirit to bring the peace of Christ to this land.

NAIDOC Week is a timely reminder of our individual and collective needs to recognise the contribution and also the gifts of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to the Church. It is also time for the Indigenous Australians to realise only they can bring that gift to help shape the identity and Mission of the Australian Church.

### Perfect with Christ

"I am not perfect" is a sentence that every one of us has said to excuse any misconduct. Christ in the gospel says: "Be perfect just as your Heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt 5:48). Is Christ asking something impossible? What does it mean "to be perfect"? When we think about something perfect, we assume getting a 100% mark, 10 out of 10 and top of the top. But the understanding of perfection in the gospel, is connected with the end of something, to be completed, whole and holy. For a puzzle to be perfect, it must have all the pieces together as it should be. In this way, we are perfect when we are completed, when we have Jesus in us.

God is perfect because he loves completely and forgives everyone equally. He is not half and half, but rather total love and sends the rain and the sun upon good and bad people alike. God wants us to have something that is not our own, a perfection only found in Jesus Christ. Christ on the cross took away our imperfections, loving us even when we are awful and to give us this love that makes us perfect. Only with Christ's love can we become perfect because only with God we are completed and whole.

A Temple is not holy and sacred for itself but for what it contains. If we contain the Spirit of Christ inside us we are the Temple of God, we are completed and perfect. We may not be able to get 100% but the seed on the rich soil sometimes gives 30%, 60% or 100%. The key is to have God with us and love as God does, so we can be completed and perfect with Christ.


