YEAR 12, 2020 WACE RESULTS

The College is very proud of the achievements of the Class of 2020 in the recent Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) examinations. Congratulations to the students and staff who have worked hard to maintain such high standards.

RESULTS OVERVIEW

99.12 % of our Year 12 students achieved the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE).

Of the students eligible to obtain an ATAR:

10 (12.2%) students achieved an ATAR greater 95

22 (26.8%) students achieved an ATAR greater 90

36 (43.9%) students achieved an ATAR greater 85

49 (59.7%) students achieved an ATAR greater 80

Our median Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) of 83.15 was above the State median of 81.65.

Based on the median ATAR score for all students who enrolled in four or more ATAR courses, Ursula Frayne ranked 41 in the State.

The College has been ranked in the Top 50 secondary schools in Western Australia for the last ten years. In 2020 the College was measured against 191 schools.

We were recognised as a high-performing school (Top 15%) in English and Maths Applications. 80% of students have been offered their first preference at University this year (this includes students from various pathways).

Through our **ASPIRE** Vocational Education and Training program, numerous students successfully transitioned into TAFE or university. Every student who undertook a Certificate IV program was offered a university placement.

For students from Year 12 who undertook a VET subject:

20 students achieved a Certificate IV

38 students achieved a Certificate III

22 students achieved a Certificate II

A Certificate of Distinction or Certificate of Merit is awarded to each eligible student who, in their last three consecutive years of senior secondary WACE enrolment, achieves: Certificate of Distinction 190-200 points and Certificate of Merit 150-189 points. When a student received 20 A grades over Year 11 & 12, they are awarded a Certificate of Distinction. Students who attended our Balmoral Campus for primary school are noted by the asterisk.
