From the Principal

Dear Parents/Caregivers, Students and Friends of Ursula Frayne Catholic College ...

This week we have been noticeably impacted on the relaxation of statewide Covid Restrictions. I encourage all students, staff, and visitors to wear masks whilst on campus. Close contacts are reminded to utilise the College Covid app to register their daily negative RAT test and always wear a mask.

Our College has now received the WA Government supply of Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs). This Thursday 19 May between the hours of 3:30pm to 6:00pm the Duncan Street Campus will be open for families to collect a box of 20 tests for each child. These RATs are for you to use for your child if they become symptomatic or if they are close household contacts. Please be mindful that while these RATs are safe for use by children, they should only be administered under the supervision of an appropriate adult.

Last week our students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 were engaged in NAPLAN (National Assessment Program, Literacy and Numeracy). The assessment regime comprises of tests. Over the course of this week, the College will provide opportunities for students to complete this, if they were absent during the week. The data that is abstracted from NAPLAN is informative when reviewing trends across the College community. NAPLAN is a snapshot of a child's academic performance and I encourage all families to remember that a student's mid semester report from the College provides the best information regarding a child's overall progress at school.

Attendance at school is critically important. The College does not support families taking their children on holidays during the academic term. If you do want to take your son or daughter out during the school term, please ensure that you write to me requesting leave.

From the Principal cont...

The biggest impact on your child's learning is the Teacher! Our staff work collaboratively to ensure that Frayne students have access to the best education. All staff engage in professional learning and most of this occurs on site with school-based colleagues. All staff are mentored and coached to improve on their professional capacity. The next student free day is on Friday 27 May 2022. Whilst these days can be challenging for families in organising care for young children, these days are critically important for our teaching teams, as they build on their existing skills and knowledge specific to the needs of the students in our care.

This term we have commenced interviews for students joining us in Year 7, 2024. These interviews are always enlightening, as I learn about the new students that will be joining us in the next few years. New families often share with me that they want their son or daughter to join Frayne, as they know of our amazing reputation. It is recognised beyond our immediate Frayne family, that we have an amazing community where children can flourish academically, spiritually, and emotionally. One parent shared with me that they travel on the train daily into the city with Frayne students. He shared with me that our students were respectful, standing if an adult needed a seat and had great manners. These attributes are highly valued by our community, and it is heart-warming when members of the public notice this. We have so much to be proud of.

Our community appreciates high standards. Thanks to all families for supporting our young people and children as we transitioned to our winter uniform last Monday. The students across the College are requested to wear the uniform with pride, and they do this well.

I welcome Mrs Leone Murphy to our HASS team this week. Leone is a very experienced educator and specialises in Geography. We are very fortunate to have her joining our staff.

Advisory Council - May meeting report

The College Advisory Council met online on Tuesday 10 May 2022.

The Council continued its consideration of options with respect to capital development planning for the College.

The Council was briefed by the A/Principal, Mrs Veronica Parker, with respect to ongoing College plans and communications to deal with the challenges associated with COVID-19, noting recent relaxation of relevant rules. The responsiveness of all staff in the circumstances in particular was acknowledged.

The Council was also briefed on commitments Catholic Education is seeking as part of the current federal election campaign under the general headings of supporting school choice, enabling faith-based education and delivering on certain national priorities.

Chaplain's Reflection

SAINT MATTHIAS APOSTLE

The feast of Saint Matthias is on the 14th of May. He is the only Apostle not chosen personally by Jesus. The Acts of the Apostle written in 63 AD tells how Matthias was elected by the apostles to replace Judas Iscariot after his betrayal of Jesus and his subsequent death. The gospels do not mention Matthias among the lists of disciples or followers of Jesus however according to the Acts, he was with Jesus from his baptism by John until the Ascension of Jesus to Heaven. This is how the Acts of Apostle tells us the story: "Beginning from the baptism of John, unto that same day that he was taken up from us, must one be ordained to be a witness with us of his resurrection. And they appointed two, Joseph called Barsabas, who was surnamed Justus, and Matthias. And they prayed, and said, Thou, Lord, which knowest the hearts of all men, shew whether of these two thou hast chosen, That he may take part of this ministry and apostleship, from which Judas by transgression fell, that he might go to his own place. And they gave forth their lots; and the lot fell upon Matthias; and he was numbered with the eleven apostles". Acts 1, 22-26

Pope Francis urges us on the feast of Saint Matthias to live our friendship with Jesus that we have receive by "lot" that is by "destiny", not by "chance". Our vocation is to be friends with Jesus. The Pope recalled the election of Matthias in the Acts of the Apostles where he was chosen by lot to be a "witness of the Resurrection", "a witness of this gift of love" of Jesus who shares with His friends the secrets revealed to Him by the Father. Even those who distance themselves from Him, the Pope said, Jesus always awaits, faithful to his friendship. The Pope thus urged Christians to ask Jesus for the grace to remain in His love, in his friendship.

O Glorious St. Matthias, in God's design it fell upon you to take the place of the unfortunate Judas who betrayed his Master.

You were selected by the twofold sign of the uprightness of your life and the call of the Holy Spirit.

Obtain for us the grace to practice the same uprightness of life and to be called by that same Spirit to wholehearted service of the Church. Then after a life of zeal and good works let us be ushered into your company in heaven to sing forever the praises of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
