WHAT YOUR CHILD SHOULD BRING

- A medium size school bag
- Library Bag
- Water Bottle with a sipper lid
- A Crunch and Sip small container packed with fruit or vegetables.
- A recess snack such as fruit or other healthy alternatives
- A healthy lunch in manageable portions. All food must be stored in a lunch box. There are no
 heating or storage facilities for the children's lunch. Please do not pack sweet biscuits, cake, lollies
 and nuts. No peanut butter or hazelnut spreads as they are harmful to children with allergies.
 - Please ensure that *all* of your child's items are **clearly labelled** with their full name on the outside (eg library bag, water bottle, lunch box etc).

WHAT YOUR CHILD SHOULD WEAR

School Uniform:

- Green Ursula Frayne Kindergarten Polo shirt
- Black shorts/track pants
- Appropriate footwear: No thongs. Joggers are to be worn on their Physical Education (PE) day.

Hats are required every day!

No hat no play; no sun for me today.

The children will be asked to put their hats on before going outside. If the children do not have a hat, they will not be allowed to play in the sun.

Spare Clothes

Please keep a change of clothes in your child's bag (throughout the school year), in case their school clothes get soiled/wet due to toilet 'accidents or water/sand play. It is essential that you regularly check these spare clothes regarding the size and their appropriateness to seasonal changes.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

Clothing should be labelled, and jewellery items left at home. Although children like to bring their favourite toys to Kindergarten, it is not a good idea as they become very upset if they get lost or broken. They may; however, be asked to bring in something special from home for our 'Interest Table' or to support their learning around a particular topic during the course of the year. We appreciate your collaboration with this.

The Environment

The Kindergarten environment is created to suit the developmental needs of young children. It is set up to provide learning experiences which have been planned and organised to encourage children to explore materials and engage in purposeful play. These include: the home corner, puzzle area, playdough table, block area, creative corner, writing table, iPad's, painting area, interest table etc.

WHAT YOUR CHILD WILL DO

Your child will play <u>but</u> don't dismiss this statement lightly. Play is carefully structured for and suited to the needs of individual children. He/she **will** play but this is how children learn. Please be assured that the children are supervised during outdoor play time.

The acquisition of literacy and numeracy concepts and understandings will be targeted through both play based explorations and explicit instruction. This will include structured synthetic phonics sessions focusing on pre-literacy skill development and the Number strand in Mathematics.

In Kindergarten, routines will be established so as to ensure familiarity, security and organisation. The children will also develop a sense of responsibility by helping to care for equipment and by 'packing-away'.

The children will be involved in and exposed to a variety of activities and experiences through which they will gain skills, knowledge and ideas in which we hope they will be able to apply in everyday situations.

OUR AIMS IN KINDERGARTEN

To develop in each child:

- a positive self-esteem
- a sense of Christian values and an awareness of God's presence in their lives
- their ability to communicate effectively and cooperate with others
- a respect for the rights of all individuals
- confidence in themselves as an active learner
- a sense of curiosity and wonder for their world
- critical thinking and problem-solving skills that they can apply to everyday situations
- the ability to use their imagination and express themselves creatively
- independence and resilience
- gross and fine motor skills appropriate to their level of development
- engagement and persistence in completing set tasks
- pride in their achievements

We aim to provide a rich and stimulating play-based program which caters to the interests and needs of the children. They will experience a broad curriculum, with a focus on literacy and numeracy, as appropriate to their individual learning journey.
