From the Principal

Dear Parents, Students and Friends of Ursula Frayne Catholic College,

THANK YOU TO THOSE WHO SERVE

In the last edition of the Newsletter, I wrote that 'serving others has always been the mark of a great person'. According to this statement, our College community is truly blessed with many, many 'great persons' who live out the spirit of our College prayer by giving 'generously in the service of others'.

As the Semester draws to a close, I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to so many students, staff, parents and caregivers who have given so generously of their time, energy and expertise to volunteer and serve others within and beyond our campuses.

In a recent edition of the *Record* (Issue 40 June 2023), Perth Auxiliary Bishop Don Sproxton paid tribute to volunteers by acknowledging the invaluable contributions they make to their communities. He shared that "many of our primary and secondary schools were financed and even physically built by the fathers and mothers who gave up their time, often on weekends and weekday evenings for the sake of their children. Without them it is hard to image what the vision of Catholic Education would have become."

Bishop Sproxton emphasised that volunteers worked hard, sometimes with very little, with their own hands, using their skills without counting the cost. *"They did not just have their own children in mind but all the children and the families of their schools and parishes,"* he said.

The Ursula Frayne Catholic College community acknowledges the Whadjuk people of the Noongar nation, the traditional owners who have walked upon and cared for this land for thousands of years. We acknowledge the continued deep spiritual attachment and relationship of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to this country and commit ourselves to the ongoing journey of reconciliation.

Chaplain's Reflection

SAINTS PETER AND PAUL

The Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul is on 29 June. This feast honours the martyrdom in Rome of these two Apostles of Christ. Peter and Paul were two very different men and they came to follow Christ in different times and ways; while Peter was called by Christ at the beginning of His public Life, Paul was called after His Resurrection in a vision. Both of them were normal and weak men, who either denied Christ or persecuted his followers. However, Christ's grace transforms them to bring His message of life to all the people.

Pope Francis said that both of them were witnesses of the transformative power of God's forgiveness through which all Christians can experience a new beginning of peace and joy: "Peter denied the Lord, while Paul persecuted the Church of God, Jesus called them by name and changed their lives. Only when we experience God's forgiveness do we truly experience rebirth. From there we start over, from forgiveness; there we rediscover who we really are in the confession of our sins". Peter and Paul understood that holiness does not consist in exalting but rather in humbling oneself. We can be encouraged by both of them because if Christ used them as they were, we too can be strength and used by God as we are.

In the presence of these witnesses, let us rediscover who we truly are through a daily relationship with Jesus and with the power of his forgiveness, become instruments of God.

We're getting ready for the Armadale Line Shutdown

We're planning replacement bus services, creating around 1.2kms of bus priority lanes and building three temporary bus interchanges.

At Victoria Park Station temporary bus interchange:

- · kerb modifications will be made along Kitchener Avenue for one vehicle at a time to pass the bus interchange
- no entry will be allowed at the end of Axon Avenue onto Kitchener Avenue and a turnaround bay will be installed
- the temporary car park will be created before major works, so there will be no interruption to the availability of car parking during works
- the number of Transperth parking bays will remain the same, two ACROD bays will be added.

What to expect during works

- Impacts will include noise, vibration, and dust, local road changes and diversions.
- Traffic management and shared path detours will be in place.
- Additional traffic controls will be installed to detour drivers and pedestrians, where necessary.
- Every effort will be made to minimise disruption.



Temporary bus interchanges will operate from around four weeks prior to the shutdown starting.
