YEAR 12, 2022 WACE RESULTS

The College is very proud of the achievements of the Class of 2022 in the recent Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) examinations and overall Year 12 achievement. Congratulations to the students and staff who have worked hard to maintain such high standards given the extra challenges of the last few years.

RESULTS OVERVIEW

96.88% of our Year 12 students achieved the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE).

Of the students eligible to obtain an ATAR:

2022

17 students. (22.7%) of ATAR students above 95

35 students. (46.7%) of ATAR students above 90

49 students. (65.3%) of ATAR students above 85

57 students. (76%) of ATAR students above 80

Our median Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) of 89.75. The College has consistently ranked highly in terms of ATAR performance over the last 10 years.

We were recognised as a high-performing school (Top 15%) in English, Human Biology, Maths Applications, Modern History, Religion & Life and Geography. English ATAR achieved the highest average for a Catholic college in CEWA schools for 2022.

73 students out of 85 students have been offered their first preference at University this year (this includes students from various pathways).

Through our **ASPIRE** Vocational Education and Training program, numerous students successfully transitioned into TAFE or university.

For students from Year 12 who undertook a VET subject over Years 11 & 12:

26 students achieved a Certificate IV

38 students achieved a Certificate III

70 students achieved a Certificate II

The ASPIRE program helped 14 students receive traineeships and apprenticeships.
