Message to the Class of 2023 - 'Wonderful Human Becomings'

The following is an abridged version of my remarks to the young men and women of the Class of 2023 delivered during their Farewell Assembly on Thursday, 20 October.

Year 12s, while your graduation is a celebration of the past it also marks the commencement of the next phases of your life journey. As such, your graduation, of course, is not the end. It is not even the beginning of the end but could be considered the end of the beginning. So, while I encourage you to cherish the past, look forward with optimism to the future where endless possibilities await you.

The reality is that none of us really knows or can accurately predict how our life will unfold. As such, my best advice is to just allow your life to flow because it will be an ongoing journey of learning, adapting, and turning struggles into something positive.

During our lives we refer to ourselves as human beings - which we are. However, I believe that we are better described as 'human becomings' because throughout our lives we will be in a constant process of change and becoming. Just like caterpillars, we do not stay the same. But, unlike caterpillars, we can make our becoming a deliberate and conscious process towards the person we are called and gifted to be.

The longer I live, the more I appreciate the impact of one's attitude on life. A wise preacher once commented that 'attitude determines altitude'. In other words, it is our attitude to life which determines how far we will progress, grow, and flourish.

*The remarkable thing is that we always have a choice regarding the attitude we will embrace at any given moment. Life is 10% what happens to us and 90% how we choose to respond to it because **we are in charge of our attitude and attitude is a choice!***

*Year 12, I trust that each of **you will live faithful and joyful lives** because both elements are interconnected. While feelings like happiness and sadness come and go, joy is more than just a feeling! Joy is like a spring or an undercurrent that runs through our lives and remains a constant - irrespective of how we are feeling. **The ultimate source of joy comes from 'living loved'** - loved by those closest to us who know and care deeply for us despite our imperfections and by living as one who believes that they are truly embraced in the perfect, unconditional love of God.*

*We are immensely proud of you and sincerely thank you for the joy and care you have brought into the Frayne community during your time with us. To me, what has characterised the Class of 2023 has been your upbeat optimism, your happiness, kindness and 'can do' attitude. You have definitely **forged a very positive legacy for others to follow.***

Thank you, Lucy, Max, Zara and Robert, – you have certainly led from the front. Individually, as a team and in collaboration with those who have led with you, you have generously served Frayne in the spirit of our College values.

*Year 12s, you have almost made it to graduation, which has taken patience, dedication, a lot of hard work and the support of many people. I have every confidence that you will have fulfilling lives; meet, love and be loved for who you are by wonderful people and make a positive difference in the world as you **journey towards becoming the best version of yourself.***

Farewell and bon voyage as you continue your journey of becoming the best version of yourselves who, after all, are made in the image and likeness of God. Thank you for the beautiful memories.
