A FINAL WORD ON BEHALF OF THE CLASS OF 2023

The student Executive Leadership Team – Lucy Crowley, Max Lim, Zara Pearson and Robert Nicolosi delivered their final address at the Year 12 Farewell Assembly on Thursday, 19 October. The following is an abridged version of their final words of advice based on their experience at Frayne.

A famous lyric from the song Dreams by The Cranberries goes, "My life is changing every day, in every possible way" – a lyric that I think resonates with every Year 12 student right now. For the past 14 years each of us have gone to school for 10 weeks a term, for four terms and now it is coming to an end. Graduation, as it stands, marks the end of one stage of our lives, where we have been surrounded day in and day out by our friends, family and teachers and the beginning of the next one, whether that is going to Uni or an apprenticeship or taking a gap year or simply figuring out what you want to do day by day.

Now that we've grown into our uniforms and the school bag that once seemed so big it would drown us to not having enough room to fit all of the books, we need to take home, it's time to say goodbye. To all the other students in front of me, know that this will be you someday soon, and you will miss it if you don't take every chance to apply yourself and make the most out of opportunities that present themselves. As the student body, you make Frayne the place it is, and it has been an honour and a privilege to serve as your Student Executive Team for 2023.

Chaplain's Reflection

HOLY WINS

The feast of All Saints on 1 November, celebrates the lives of many men and women, known and unknown, who lived holy lives and are now rejoicing in Heaven. On 2 November, we celebrate the feast of All Souls and pray for all the people who have died but are not yet in Heaven. These people, the Church teaches us, are in Purgatory, that is "the state of those who die in God's friendship, assured of their eternal salvation, but who still have need of purification to enter into the happiness of Heaven".

These feasts come to make us think about something we'd rather not want to think about: death. Death is something real and each one of us will have to face it one day. Pope Francis said: "A culture that forgets death begins to die within...he who forgets death has already begun to die. Death comes as a slap in the face to our illusion of omnipotence. It teaches us throughout life to engage ourselves with mystery. This gives us confidence to jump into the void and to realise that we will not fall, that we will not sink, and that there is always Someone there to catch us. Remember, if death is not to have the last word, it is because in life we learned to die for one another."

Death can bring fear and anxiety into our lives because we can see death like a monster that comes to devour us. Now, it is easy to understand that people will dress up as monsters, zombies, skeletons and evil pumpkins. But this is not how the Church celebrates this time. We celebrate that Christ dying for us on the cross and rising to new life, has defeated death and His victory is also for us. Death is no longer a monster but as St Francis used to say "sister Death" that comes to bring us to Heaven. We celebrate that 'Holy Wins' always; that all men and women who live holy lives share in the victory of Christ and arrive to eternal life in Heaven.

We are also called to discover that 'Holy Wins' in our life and that God has power over all our fears, problems and sins. Let us pray together with all Saints, for all our brothers and sister in Purgatory, so that one day we will meet together in Heaven.
