# **Chaplain's Reflection**

#### THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

The month of November is the last month of the Church's Liturgical Year and is dedicated to praying for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. We started this month with the Feast of All Saints on 1 November, celebrating the lives of many men and women, known and unknown who lived holy lives and are now rejoicing in Heaven. On 2 November, we celebrated the feast of All Souls and prayed for all the people who have died but are not yet in Heaven.

The Church prays for the person who dies from the moment of death. Families will gather together to share their grief and the Order of Christian Funerals helps with some celebrations like: a Vigil Service, the funeral Mass and the Rite of Committal at the burial site. These services express our faith in the resurrection and gives hope that God will prepare a place for them in Heaven. After that, the Church encourages us to pray for all those who have gone before us into eternity. When we pray for the dead we build up our relationship with the community of the Church. Because the Church believes in the Communion of Saints that means, that all people who have died continue to be members of the community of the Church. All Saints in Heaven, all Souls in Purgatory and all of us living in the Church today, we all form the Church.

Let us pray together with all Saints, for all our brothers and sister in Purgatory, so that one day we will meet together in Heaven:

"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen"
