Bronwen's outstanding commitment and dedication to the numerous students, staff and families that she has supported through her involvement in Friends of Frayne, College Boards, Advisory Councils and more broadly through Catholic Education in Western Australia are to be acknowledged and celebrated.

2024 School Budget

During the meeting, the College budget for 2024 was considered. College Business Manager, **Jody Cabalzar**, on behalf of CAC Treasurer, Jason Fair, gave an insight into the complexities that have had to be negotiated in preparing this annual fiscal plan.

One of the key ingredients discussed was the annual school fee increase. College management and the Advisory Council are very cognisant of the impact that school fee increases can have for members of our school community. Every effort has been made to keep fee increases at the minimum required to ensure adequate resources are provided for the teaching and learning operation of the College.

For 2024 the CAC has endorsed a budget based on a 6% increase to tuition and associated fees.

While community expectations of schools, both public and independent, continue to grow, Ursula Frayne Catholic College is committed to ensuring that the College continues to provide a high quality, affordable and sustainable Catholic education, especially during the current economic climate.

While the College is financially viable, recent changes to the distribution of Government funding to Catholic schools will require continued careful management of the budget. I understand that the impact of this increase has the potential to put considerable strain on household budgets. Every year, the College makes provision for families facing financial hardship, perhaps through changed personal or economic circumstances. If you feel that you may need assistance in meeting your school fee obligation, please contact the Business Manager directly to discuss if you might be eligible for assistance.

I am confident that any peer comparison of Ursula Frayne's fees or expenditure, using the *My School* website, will show that our fees are not excessive, and our expenditure is modest and well managed for the level of service offered. If you have friends, neighbours, or colleagues with children, I encourage you to share the gift of our *learning and faith sharing community, centred in Christ* with them as well. Supporting future enrolments is one of the most important ways to ensure an active, vibrant future for Ursula Frayne Catholic College.

I am very happy to make myself available to meet with any families who may like to discuss or enquire further in relation to school fees and their impact on your family. Chaplain's Reflection

CHRIST THE KING

This coming Sunday we will celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. Jesus wants to be the King of our life, not by ruling and dominating us but by guiding us, feeding us, protecting us and healing us. This is what Christ does for us and will empower us to live our lives centred in Him.



Pope Francis encourages us to live in this way: "Christ is the centre of the history of humanity and also the centre of the history of every individual. To him we can bring the joys and the hopes, the sorrows and troubles which are part of our lives. When Jesus is the centre, light shines even amid the darkest times of our lives; he gives us hope, as he does to the good thief in today's Gospel. Whereas all the others treat Jesus with disdain – "If you are the Christ, the Messiah King, save yourself by coming down from the cross!" – the thief who went astray in his life but now repents, clings to the crucified Jesus and begs him: "Remember me, when you come into your kingdom" (Lk 23:42). Jesus promises him: "Today you will be with me in paradise" (v. 43), in his kingdom. Jesus speaks only a word of forgiveness, not of condemnation; whenever anyone finds the courage to ask for this forgiveness, the Lord does not let such a petition go unheard. Today we can all think of our own history, our own journey. Each of us has his or her own history: we think of our mistakes, our sins, our good times and our bleak times. We would do well, each one of us, on this day, to think about our own personal history, to look at Jesus and to keep telling him, sincerely and quietly: "Remember me, Lord, now that you are in your kingdom! Jesus, remember me, because I want to be good, but I just don't have the strength: I am a sinner, I am a sinner. But remember me, Jesus! You can remember me because you are at the centre, you are truly in your kingdom!" How beautiful this is! Let us all do this today, each one of us in his or her own heart, again and again. "Remember me, Lord, you who are at the centre, you who are in your kingdom".

Let us allow Christ to be our King and enjoy living in His Kingdom.

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC TUITION PROGRAM

Students currently enrolled in the Music Tuition lesson program do not need to submit another music tuition application form if you're intending to continue music tuition in 2024. Music tuition rolls over into the next calendar year automatically.

As per the Music Tuition Terms and Conditions.

"Once students enrol for music tuition at the College, their enrolment remains in place until they either complete their schooling at the end of Year 12 or submit the appropriate withdrawal form".

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC STUDENTS

The College has removed the fee for instrument hire over the Christmas holidays and as such all students continuing tuition/ensembles in 2024 are required to take their instruments home with them over the Christmas holidays (unless it is being serviced/repaired by the College). This assists staff with stocktake and the safety of instruments.

Any students who leave their instrument behind will be phoned and required to come in and pick-up the instrument during the first week of holidays.

Students who are withdrawing from tuition or leaving the College and are hiring a College owned instrument, need to return the instrument at the conclusion of their lessons in Week 9 or after their final performance commitment.


Please join us in extending a HUGE THANK YOU and fond farewell to two college parents who have both made phenomenal contributions during their journeys as school parents.
